### MATTERS ARISING:

The coaching budget had not yet been received for 2005 or 2006

Cleeve Archers have purchased some land and were waiting for a change of use planning certificate.

### SECRETARY

Janet reported with sadness that Don Gould had died during Dunster week.

Janet thanked archers and counties for the donation towards her JAN2 scooter

The executive had made a few decisions since the last meeting; the agreement of a donation to JAN2. £845 collected at Dunster, £500 SCAA, £500 D&W, £500 Hampshire, £250 GAS, £110 from others.

Andrew Calloway a grant towards international travel.

Colin and Ann Holmes are to run the junior winter postal again.

The entry fee for the GWAS indoor championships was to rise to £8.00.

There was some confusion amongst archers with regards to self funding international tournaments; the directors were to consider the matter further.

Danesfield now have a junior and senior club as well as a new disabilities club which carries free subscription.

Information for the GWAS Diary was required by the 1<sup>st</sup> of January 2006.

Tim Pratt was seeking information to put on the web site.

Subscriptions are late arriving this year due to a problem with The GNAS forms.

John Poyner commented that the new system had been delivered and would be ready for next season, after which clubs will be able to affiliate on line.

Chris H set up a table of memorabilia at Dunster which was well received by archers.

### TOURNAMENT SECRETARY:

205 archers were on the line at Dunster Longbow Day. Lady Hermione was Lady P, she donated 2 magnums of champagne.

Amanda was thanked for organising the Junior champs Janet said she had received nothing but praise from those attending the event.

Quicks were missed this year, but the next day mail order system helped a lot of archers, it was thought that Quicks would be present next year with maybe a display van.

Record status had been booked for Dunster next year 11 to the 18<sup>th</sup> fees to be increase by 25p per round.

A pair of silver napkin rings was being considered to be presented by SCAA, as each of the GWAS's Lady and Gentleman regional longbow champions' trophy.

Nick said he had a few trophies, which could be presented to the regional field longbow champions.

GAS and other individuals had commented on the poor dress code used at the inter-counties counties to be informed that the code should be green and or white or all in county colours.

The inter-counties Championships would be held at Exeter on the 17<sup>th</sup> of September assembly 09:45, (15 minutes early)

### TREASURER:

Dunster made a profit of £2,778, £20 being lost on tournaments over the year. There was £99,040 in the bank as affiliations had not yet been paid.

Lyne Acres would not be available for the judge's conference, other venues were being considered which may require a small increase in their budgeted figure.
