### 2 MATTERS ARISING FROM THE OCTOBER MEETING

Dave Monk asked that full names be used in the minutes to avoid confusion.

### 3 REPORTS

**A Chairman** Chris Hassall stated that the outdoor season was now in full swing and that at a recent Bath tournament only nine archers attended. He suggested that clubs urge their members to attend tournaments to avoid them being cancelled.

Telephone call from Alex Kerby to say that Ann Jackson has been accepted as a candidate judge and will be available with her whistle to any one who requires her!

**C Treasurer** Current account approximately £1533

**D Coaching** See attached. Ann Jackson advised all that a coaching fund exists but is held within the normal funds in order to get the best interest deal. It was agreed that the coaching group would request amounts from Ann Jackson direct. Doug Human to put a notice of the forthcoming coaches meeting on the web site and invite anyone interested, he also extended the invite to all from SCAA council.

**E Juniors** Amanda Tompkins reported that forms for the SCAA/GWAS junior champs are available. She also requested that all prospective competitors send their best scores in so she can make up the county team. Chris Hassall reported that the Margaret Lewis medal has been engraved for recipient Emma Coward.

**F Tournaments** Tim Jackson said that RAFA have offered funding to replace the two visitors trophies awarded at the Battle of Britain FITA. It was agreed to ask Mark Jones and Keith Elsley to confirm their offer to run the Interclub this year. Ann Jackson advised that the GWAS AGM for next year would have to be moved to earlier in the year due to Easter. This would then conflict with the traditional date for the Somerset indoor champs. After discussion it was agreed to move this event to the last week in February.

**G Field** No Report. Both Andy and Jane have been taking part in National squad training and Jane has been selected for the world champs in Croatia.

**H Flight and Clout & Target** This item heading is to be deleted and replaced with **Webmaster**

- K Records** All on SCAA web site and up to date.
- L Postal** Final results – Frostbite – Bath/Puriton/Burnham  
Portsmouth - Puriton/Burnham/Bath  
Damian Le Gresley proposed that the trophy be awarded at Dunster after the outdoor champs. A vote was tied so the Chairman cast a status quo vote.
- 4 GWAS Report** There was no Somerset representation at the last GWAS meeting due to lack of communication. It was agreed that in future if nominated reps cannot attend they would notify the secretary (SCAA). Ann Jackson (chairman of GWAS committee) stated that her capacity at the meeting was as chairman and she could not act in any way on behalf of Somerset.  
Ann Jackson advised that GWAS are considering the employment of a Development Officer. To this end they have asked all counties to advise at the next GWAS meeting the items a Development Officer should address. After discussion Ann Jackson compiled a prioritised list from suggestions made.

- 6 Any Other Business**
- a) Equipment Officers list. Dave Monk had prepared a list of all items held by him and belonging to SCAA. After discussion it was agreed that the following items be retained: - Scoreboards, County Flag, pole and spike, County tablecloth, County Gonfalon and Indoor back stop net. The following items would be scrapped: -First Aid kit, electric typewriter and used faces. The remaining items would be disposed of by advertising them on the web site to go to the highest bidder or best cause.
  - b) A list of approved bursaries is to be generated
  - c) West Somerset council are organising ‘Actifest’, a collection of sporting activities for people to try. WSCA and Danesfield are both involved.
  - d) Damian Le Gresley advised that the web site has now been set up on a new server, which is more reliable and has more features. The cost to SCAA will be around £100 pa. Any additions or suggestions for the site should be passed to Damian Le Gresley.
  - e) After discussion it was agreed to make Damian Le Gresley and Claire Davey honorary members of SCAA.
  - f) After discussion a proposal is to be made for the next meeting. In order to reset county records individuals must submit scores made between Dec 2004 and Dec 2005, the highest submitted at the end of the period will then be the new record. Scores must be achieved at tournaments not club events.
  - g) Proposal for the next meeting is that longbow awards are to be judged on scores only at all one-way events organised by the County.
  - h) Hilary Collins asked for confirmation of the current SCAA affiliation fee - £29.00
